





Peter Snayers, Joyous Entry of Ferdinand, c. 1635 – *MAS collection* 






A bird's eye view of the citadel, by Frans Hogenberg, 1572 – Collection City Archives Antwerp







Picture of the Keizerspoort, right before it was demolished in the 1860s – *Collection City Archives Antwerp* 



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


The New Exchange, built 1531-1533 – Collection State Archives Belgium

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







The New Jesuit church, built 1615-1621 – *Collection Dyrham, Gloucestershire* 



Anonymous, plan showing the siting of the new Jesuit Church across the Korte Rui (Short Ditch), ca. 1615.






The "Nieuwstad" redisgned by Gilbert Van Schoonbeke around 1550 – *Collection City Archives Antwerp* 










Etchings of the Rubenshouse by Jacobus Harrewijn, 1692 – *Rubenshuis Collection* 




Detail of map Antwerpia Mercatorum Emporium, c. 1521 – Collection Plantin-Moretus Antwerp




Modern reconstruction of the medieval and sixteenth-century enlargements.











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
Engraving by Theodoor Van Thulden in J.C. Gevartius, *Pompa Introïtus Ferdinandi*, Antwerp, 1642.












Housing units before and after the straightening of the Scheldt quays.

The Antwerp docks in 1897.




Preliminary design of the General structural masterplan Antwerp, presumably drawn and hand-coloured in the years 1955/1956. Striking is the "green belt" of agricultural land and the non-construction zones earmarked for parks. Also shown is the never-realized "large Ring" as outer limit of the city and conductor of heavy traffic.








Map from the atlas Kansarmoede in de grootstad Antwerpen (Disadvantage in th Metropolis of Antwerp) (1987). In the shaded areas quality of life was demonstrably less and there was a greater clustering of 'risk groups' and 'problem groups'.

Designs by Christian Nieckensforthe the architectural design competition "City on the Stream", builded in 1990. The aim was to create green spaces along the Scheldt, reopening the Zaiderdokken (South Docks) and the building of new residential units on Het Blandje (The Isler).
